

A Place for Exceptional Rehabilitation Care

Marianjoy Rehabilitation Hospital in Wheaton, Illinois, has been providing physical rehabilitation services for over 40 years. One of our primary goals at Marianjoy is to return our patients to a community setting. We work to achieve this goal by providing medical care, nursing, and therapy aimed at improving each patient's ability to participate in daily activities. On weekdays, patients are scheduled for at least three hours of therapy; 95% of our patients receive at least three hours of therapy. For fiscal 2015 (July 1, 2014 – June 30, 2015), Marianjoy discharged 2,277 inpatient rehabilitation facility patients; 1,453 (64%) were discharged to the community, 552 (24%) were discharged to a subacute / skilled nursing facility, and 273 (12%) were discharged to acute care. Patients who achieved predicted outcomes in self-care at discharge averaged 52% (1,184) and those who achieved predicted outcomes in mobility averaged 52% (1,190), with 60% (1,391) achieving or exceeding their walking/wheelchair goal and 69% (1,579) achieving their climbing stairs goal.

Admission and Discharge Criteria

Most patients are referred to Marianjoy by their physicians or discharge planners at the acute care hospital. Patients are admitted to Marianjoy if the following admission criteria are met:

- Patient requires a pre-admission screening by a physician to approve admission prior to inpatient rehabilitation;
- Patient requires a coordinated program of rehabilitative care provided by an interdisciplinary treatment team with multiple therapies;
- Patient requires close medical management with a physician and rehabilitation nurse available 24 hours every day;
- Patient must be able to tolerate and will receive intensive therapy (average 3 hours a day); and
- Patient demonstrates potential for significant practical improvement and actively participates.

Patients are discharged (transitioned) to a different level of care when:

- Patient has met the established goals or is **not** making progress towards the goals.
- Patient is no longer able to meet all inpatient rehabilitation criteria described above; or
- Patient's condition requires acute care hospitalization.

What Our Patients Say About Us

Marianjoy surveys patients shortly after discharge to learn what they like about our services and how we can improve them. We monitor patient's ratings and comments by using comparisons to a national database (administered by Press Ganey) of 154 inpatient rehabilitation centers throughout the country.

On our satisfaction survey results, our discharged patients' average (mean) score was 94.6 when asked about the "likelihood of recommending Marianjoy". This outcome was associated with the 82nd percentile rank, meaning Marianjoy patient satisfaction was better than 82% of all facilities in the Press Ganey database. The "overall care while an inpatient at Marianjoy" resulted in a mean score of 94.0 for this time period, and was associated with the 81st percentile rank. At the three month follow-up after discharge, 89% of the patients reported being "very satisfied" or "somewhat satisfied" with their goal achievement and 88% for overall satisfaction with the inpatient rehabilitation experience. At the three month follow-up, 92% of the patients reported they were able to care for themselves and were living in the community.

Pediatric Program

Marianjoy also has a pediatric inpatient program that serves children with various disabilities. In 2014, 45 pediatric patients were discharged from Marianjoy. The average age of our pediatric patients was 11 years (range was <1 to 18 years). Seventy-eight percent (n=35) of the pediatric patients were discharged to a community setting. Patients who achieved predicted outcomes in self-care at discharge ranged between 60% (n=27) to 73% (n=33); for cognition at discharge ranged between 80% (n=36) and 87% (n=39); and for mobility at discharge ranged from 62% (n=28) to 69% (n=31).

The overall pediatric mean inpatient satisfaction score was 95.1 and this was associated with the 99th percentile rank, compared to the Press Ganey database; the highest rank achievable. The overall mean score for inpatients' satisfaction with their physician was 96.9 and this was associated with the 98th percentile rank.
